- Discuss the components of injection technique and the relation to good glycemic control

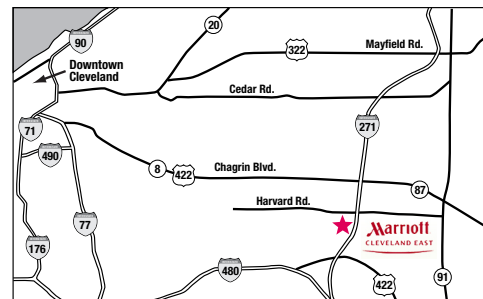
WHO SHOULD ATTEND
